

LOUVRE HOTELS GROUP COMMITMENTS AND PROGRESS IN FAVOUR OF ANIMAL WELFARE

Cage-free eggs

In 2017, we committed to using exclusively cage-free eggs by the end of 2025. This commitment includes both fresh eggs and the eggs used to make egg products and applies to all the group's brands worldwide.

In December 2025, despite our efforts, we were unable to meet our objectives across all our brands worldwide. We are actively pursuing the initiatives already underway to honor our commitments as quickly as possible, particularly in close collaboration with our suppliers. At the same time, alongside the major hotel groups within the World Sustainable Hospitality alliance (WSHA), we remain committed to exploring transparent and effective solutions for cage-free egg sourcing, with the aim of overcoming this delay and progressing toward our objectives.

Here is the progress of the Group (July 2026) :

- **France** : In 2026, our purchasing platform offers 100%* of cage-free eggs references (code 0, code 1 and code 2).
- **Rest of Europe** : More than 96%* of supplies come from cage-free sources (code 0, code 1 and code 2).
 - Poland : 100%*
 - Netherlands : 100%*
 - Belgium : 100%*
 - Germany : 100%*
 - Austria : 100%*
 - Italy : 60%*
- **Rest of the world** :
 - Africa : 50%* of supplies come from cage-free sources.
 - Asia : 12%* of supplies come from cage-free sources.
 - Middle-East : 9%* of supplies come from cage-free sources.
 - Brazil : 14%* of supplies come from cage-free sources.

Chicken meat

We commit to using exclusively chicken meat that comes from farms that comply with all the criteria of the European Chicken Commitment (ECC) by the end of the year 2026. This commitment applies to all our establishments across Europe. In addition, in France at least 20% of these chicken meat volumes will come from farms that meet the criteria and guarantee that the birds have access to free range or a winter garden.

Here is the progress of the Group (July 2026) :

- **In France** : 28%* of our chicken meat supply comes from farms meeting all the ECC criteria.
- **Rest of Europe** : 36%* of our chicken meat supply comes from farms meeting all the ECC criteria.
 - Poland** : 27%*
 - Netherlands : 100%*
 - Belgium : 67%*
 - Germany : 30%*
 - Austria : 0%*
 - Italy : 0%

The Group is working with its suppliers and the relevant departments to source chicken meat that meets the ECC criteria, with the aim of achieving the targets by the end of 2026.
